

## AdiIRC - \$1- - # 5

Added in 1.9.0

### \$1-\$N

Returns a range of tokens associated with current script.

You can use \$N- to refer to parameters N and onward, and \$N-M to refer to token \$N through to \$M. To refer to a whole line, you would use \$1-.

Can be prefixed with # to ensure the resulted text starts with a channel prefix.

### Example

```
on *:TEXT:***:Number of tokens in the incoming message is $0 first token is $1 all tokens is $1-
```

```
alias Example {  
  ; Tokenize the string 'a,b,c,d'.  
  /tokenize 44 a,b,c,d  
  
  ; Print number of tokens.  
  echo -ag Number of tokens is $0 first token is $1 all tokens is $1-  
}
```

; \$1 can be combined with regular text without using \$+.  
; NB If your text contains a number, AdiIRC skips every character in your text up to the last number and uses the remaining text.

```
alias Example {  
  ; Tokenize the string 'abcd' into just one token.  
  /tokenize 32 abcd  
  
  ; Prints 'abcde'.  
  echo -ag Combined text is $1-e  
}
```
